Option 1: Sedation & Collection (Initial Visit) \$3,969.00

1. Green Landscaping and the City of Sylacauga will work in conjunction with a local veterinarian.
2. The local veterinarian will provide a sedative that can be administered to or over existing food sources.
3. The sedative may remain in the sole possession of the veterinarian so long as they are willing to apply sedative as needed.
4. If sedative is to be provided to another involved party, veterinarian must issue any legal prescription needed to possess sedative.
5. Sedative will be applied over existing food sources to increase chance of feral canine consumption.
6. Sedative will be applied as directed by veterinarian.
7. Once incapacitated, canines can be safely collected from undesired areas with limited risk.
8. Collected canines will be placed directly into the custody of local animal control team.
9. This work can be performed at any time and with the least amount of liability to the public, the City of Sylacauga, collecting agents and the animals.

Option 2: Onsite Dispatch (Initial Visit) \$12,696.00

1. Use firearms to dispatch feral canines on site.
2. Canines will be collected and disposed of with local animal control dept.
3. Firearms will be .22 caliber rifles with suppressors and thermal sights.
4. This work will be performed after business hours for all areas performed.
5. The City of Sylacauga and Sylacauga Police Dept. must provide express permission for the work to be performed within city limits.
6. Green Landscaping requests that a representative of Sylacauga Police Dept. remain with staff members during this process for the assurance of safety and civility during this process.
7. Consent for access from private property owners needs to be acquired by the City of Sylacauga in the event that access is needed.
8. This option and method of control yields the greatest liability to the City of Sylacauga, the public in general and Green Landscaping.
9. Due to the high level of liability involved in this method of control, Green Landscaping would request indemnity from the City of Sylacauga while performing this scope of work.

Green Landscaping & Maintenance
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10. Every measure possible will be taken to protect any off-target item from damage or injury.

Option 3: Trapping & Collection (Initial Visit) \$4,680.00

1. Installation of 12 offset foot traps in high impact areas.
2. Feral canines can be baited to trap areas and trapped in this manner.
3. Collection of canines from traps will be performed with the assistance of local animal control team.
4. Canines will be placed directly into the custody of animal control after removal from trap.
5. This method of control can be hazardous to public image if canines are spotted in traps before collection effort is made.
6. Placement of traps would be in places where least amount of visibility is possible but cannot be entirely prevented.
7. This work can be performed at any time but is not without hazard to both the public and collection agents.
8. Trapping areas will need to be clearly marked so as to limit risk of potential injury to pedestrians.

Repeat Visit (Any Option)

\$3,459.00

1. Repeat visits for each method of control will be a flat daily rate.
2. Changes to method of control or previously procured materials will result in a change of cost.
3. Conditions set forth in each option are required for each follow up visit.

Workmanship & Warranty:

- 1.) Green Landscaping agrees to furnish all necessary labor, materials and equipment to complete scope of work mentioned above. We are also licensed and insured to perform scope of work.

Failure to receive payment in full for this project may result in the voiding of this warranty.
- 3.) Green Landscaping will not be held liable for improper plant selection, design errors or planting specifications of any group or persons not affiliated with Green.
- 4.) Green Landscaping is not responsible for subsurface issues that could potentially hinder planting, irrigation, hardscapes or any other work that is intended. In the event of discovering unknown obstacles such as these, additional costs may be incurred by the owner to enable completion of the work outlined.
- 5.) Green Landscaping is not responsible for damages to any underground or hidden items that are not clearly marked or guarded. Line Locator services will be utilized to indicate the location of underground utilities such as: gas, power, cable/tv, water from main to meter. Items excluded from this list may be at risk.

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- 6.) All plant material is subject to availability at the time of installation. If material is not readily available, an adequate substitution will be recommended to the client.
- 7.) Modifications to the scope of work outlined will be confirmed in writing by both parties and may be priced directly or on a time and material basis.
- 8.) Green Landscaping reserves the right to document its activities on any jobsite through the use of photography or other methods of recording. These images, recordings or other data may be used by our organization to create social media posts in a professional manner to promote our organization, industry associates and industry.

Payment Procedures:

1.) For non-maintenance customers, a deposit payment will be provided by the customer before work may begin. Upon the completion of services outlined above, the customer agrees to pay the remaining balance at the time of completion. For Green maintenance customers, upon the completion of services outlined above, the customer agrees to pay Green Landscaping the full dollar amount proposed for this work, by check, credit card or bank draft. In the event that a project exceeds one month in duration, an invoice reflecting the progression of service may be sent. The monthly installment is due on a net 10 day basis. A failure to fulfill payment within the 10 day period will result in a 5% finance charge.

- A 50% deposit is required for all projects under \$50,000.00.

Work Session Discussion Items:

Old Business:
